Crime and disorder overview

Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour in Coquetdale during autumn has continued to remain low. There was one (1) reported crime in September, Twenty (20) crimes in October and three (3) in November. The sudden increase in October related to crimes which included thefts of manhole covers and other metal related thefts to which arrests have been made. Also there was a shed burglary, theft of sheep, domestic assault, damage to a motor vehicle, theft of a motor vehicle and fire damage to a caravan. Violent crime and Burglary Dwelling remain the lowest in the Northumbria Police Force area. Anti Social Behaviour is also very low.

The key message is not to be complacent. Let's continue to work together to keep crime and disorder low. Please report anything suspicious or of concern.

Progress update on current community identified policing priorities:

- Engagement
- Speeding
- Parking

Coquetdale Neighbourhood Policing Team have continued to focus on addressing the above identified Community Priorities:

- Road Safety initiatives with the Fire Service, to target drivers aged 17 to 25yrs
- Motor Cycle Signage (30) displaying 'Bends DEAD ahead' and Speed to DIE for' were erected on five key routes, to deter fatal or serious motor cycle related collisions. To date there had only been one motor cycle collision at Otterburn, where a motor cyclist suffered leg injuries (non life threatening).
- Interactive Speed Signs – Around 50 prevention letters sent
- Summer plan enforcement – 29 Fixed Penalty Notices sent and 22 warnings
- Leaflets to deter inconsiderate parking
- Notices to prevent Anti-Social Behaviour (Fly Camping)
- Recruitment of fourteen (14) Neighbourhood Police Volunteers

The Rothbury Remembrance Service and Parade was well attended and very successful. The event was very respectful, dignified and a credit to the Coquetdale Community. Police will continue to prioritise and support this important event of both local and national significance.



CRIME PREVENTION

As cold winter nights approach, Coquetdale Police reminds everyone to focus on crime prevention, ensure that if you are going out for the evening that you make the house look occupied by keeping a light on in the house, and if possible either a radio or TV should be left on. As always can you secure all tools and gardening equipment in a locked shed or out house. Ensure vehicles are secure with keys and valuables removed. Please contact police immediately if you have any concerns about suspicious vehicles or people in your area.

FIRE PREVENTION
