CRIME OVERVIEW

Crime and anti-social behaviour in Coquetdale remains very low:

There were five crimes reported to police in October (this includes theft of diesel, theft of a wheel barrow and criminal damage to a TV cable).

This has reduced further, to three crimes in November and one in December so far, as detailed below:

•	11/11/12 to 13/11/12	Burglary to an out building at Embleton Hall, Longframlington where a Honda lawn mower was stolen
•	25/11/12	Assault at Gregory Court (two men assaulted). Two local men arrested. Enquiries progressing
•	25/11/12	Disorderly conduct at Addycombe Gardens, Rothbury. A £80 Fixed Penalty Notice issued to a local resident
•	10/12/12 to 12/12/12	Burglary to a remote farm out building in Harbottle, where diesel was stolen from an insecure vehicle.

Coquetdale remains one of the safest areas to live, work and visit in the Northumbria Police area.

However, there is still a problem with the theft of fuel, metal and farm plant and quads.

- Please do not be complacent. Let's all be vigilant and continue to work together to keep crime and disorder low.
- Please promptly report anyone or any vehicles that appear suspicious. Use the 999 system.

Key messages for December:

'If in doubt - keep them out' campaign - tackling doorstep crime, bogus callers and uninvited traders Any concerns, people should phone police on 101 or 999 if it's a priority.

Domestic Violence Campaign – 'Are you always walking on egg shells?' All domestic abuse victims have the right to live without fear or violence. For independent and confidential advice call 0800 066 5555. In an emergency call the police on 999.

Drink Drive. The best advice is don't drink and drive.

If you're planning to drink alcohol, plan how to get home without driving

Options include agreeing on a designated driver, saving a taxi number in your phone, or finding out about public transport routes and times before you go out.

If you drink alcohol at home

Unplanned events can lead to situations happening either while drinking at home or after drinking, which leads to someone driving. Remember home measures are generally more generous than pub measures. There can be no excuse for drinking and driving. Don't be tempted to drink and drive.

If you do drink alcohol

Do allow sufficient time after drinking before driving to allow your body to rid itself of ALL the alcohol.

Don't offer an alcoholic drink to someone you know is planning to drive

Even if you're not driving, you can help reduce the number of people who are killed and injured every year by drink driving.

Don't accept a lift from a driver you know has drunk alcohol

A 69 year-old man from Rothbury was arrested following a Road Traffic Collision on November 20. He was subsequently convicted of drink driving and banned for 20 months.
